Congress Needs a Marshal

"Congress needs a U.S. Marshal in the House and the voters of San Joaquin, Contra Costa and Sacramento Counties can elect Retired U.S. Marshal Tony Amador this coming election, by voting for former U.S. Marshal Tony Amador," Carl Burton President of Republicans of River City told a local group of Republican Party leaders last week.

California Governors: Jerry Brown, George Deukmejian, and Pete Wilson appointed Marshal Amador to positions of leaderships, which include Vice Chair, California Public Employment Relations Board; Director, California Youth Authority; Chairman, Youthful Offender Parole Board; Deputy Director, Employment Development Department, and Member of the Narcotic Addict Evaluation Authority.

The Honorable Antonio (Tony) C. Amador was appointed as Vice Chairman of the U.S. Merit Systems Protection Board by President George H. W. Bush. Tony served for seven years in Washington D.C. He returned to California in 1997 and subsequently was appointed by President George W. Bush as the United States Marshal for the Eastern District of California. The Eastern District runs from the Oregon State border to Bakersfield and the Nevada State border to Vallejo.

"As the former President of the San Joaquin County Economic Development Association, I know San Joaquin County needs jobs and Tony's number one priority is the creation of jobs for the district," Burton said.

"Amador's second priority is education because he knows you can't get a good job without a good education and he will work with students, parents, and teachers to make class rooms a place of learning," Burton said. Burton is the former Chairman of the Lodi School Site Council and former Co-Chairman of Friends of Public Education for San Joaquin County. Amador received his Juris Doctor from the University of the Pacific - McGeorge School of Law.

"Amador has demonstrated his ability to work with both Democrats and Republicans in solving the problems facing America and will work with all the members of Congress to solve our immigration problems," Burton added.

Tony Amador was recently endorsed for Congress by the largest volunteer Republican organization in Sacramento County, the Republicans of River City.

Burton said, "By voting for Tony Amador for Congress the American people get a crime fighter, an employment expert, and a U.S. Marshal in the House."
