Today Antonio C. 'Tony' Amador, candidate for the 9th Congressional District, issued a challenge to the incumbent Congressman, Jerry McNerney, to a minimum of three (3) debates before the General Election, which takes place on November 4, 2014.

The citizens deserve a debate between the two candidates seeking the 9th Congressional District.

Amador stated that "like Waldo, McNerney is hard to find and even harder to pin down on the important issues facing the constituents of the 9th Congressional District."

"I propose a series of debates that will include the important issues of Crime, Unemployment, Immigration Reform, Water Storage and Control, The 'High Speed Rail', and Veterans issues. If the congressman wants to add other issues I am amenable to his suggestions", stated Amador.

" At a time when congress is held in such low repute, it would behoove Congressman McNerney to face the public that he has purportedly represented for the past 8 years."

The debates could take place in a series of one debate daily for three days, or, a debate every other day, or one long debate and take questions from the audience.

The format would necessitate dealing with a block of issues, perhaps 3 or 4 per debate. The Hosts could be the League of women voters, The Stockton Record, Lodi News Sentinel, University of the Pacific, or Delta College.

Transparency in representation, prior to the vote of the public is of paramount importance.

" Time to face the music Jerry," " quit choreographing your public appearances," stated Amador, "the public deserves better."
